Primary care →



Your **primary care** doctor provides preventive and principal day-to-day medical care:

Examples

Routine exams, annual physicals, ongoing care for non-emergent conditions, and overall wellness services.

Urgent care →



Urgent care is for non-emergency medical conditions:

Examples

Broken bones, sprains and strains, cuts, scrapes and rashes, fevers, vomiting and/or diarrhea.

Care resource

For patients whose condition is not life-threatening but needs to be handled promptly, Pasadena Community Urgent Care Center (PCUC) offers outpatient care on a walk-in basis without an appointment. Emergency care →



The **emergency room** is for emergency medical conditions:

Examples

Suspected heart attack or stroke, sudden loss of consciousness, major burns, bleeding that will not stop, severe unexplained pain. When in doubt, always call 911.

Care resource

Our emergency department offers care for patients with severe or life-threatening medical problems or injuries requiring swift treatment. Trauma care



Trauma care is for life-threatening injuries:

Examples

Injuries sustained during an accident, fall or attack. Call 911.

Care resource

Our trauma center provides care around the clock and throughout the year. Trauma team members provide high-quality response when every second counts. Care may begin even before patients arrive at the trauma center, thanks to mobile intensive care nurses in our Elsa and Tom Grether Police and Medical Services Workroom, who provide medical input to paramedics *en route*.
